

# San Juan Bible Camp COVID-19 Plan

## Programming Plan

Camper registration: Families will be encouraged to social distance and be given opportunity to check in campers with proper social distance from other families.

Cabins: Campers will be checked daily for COVID-19 symptoms by the cabin counselor. Cabin groups will not be required to wear masks as they are considered a cohort. Cabin groups will stay within their cohort and maintain at least a 6 feet distance from other cabin cohorts for all activities, meals and chapel which are outside. Bathhouse use will be scheduled for each cabin cohort in the morning and evening. Every effort will be made to help campers not need to wear masks but if campers desire to wear masks, they are welcome to do so.

Campers who display COVID-19 symptoms:

1. Will immediately be separated from their cohort and check in with the nurse.
2. Will have a parent/guardian notified for the camper to be sent home.
3. Arrangements will be made for the camper to be isolated for 10 days and/or tested. The campers in the impacted cohort will have their parents contacted to update them with pertinent information.
4. The impacted cohort will continue with the normal camp schedule, staying socially distanced away from all other campers and staff.

Staff: Camp staff who are not in a cohort will be required to social distance and wear masks while inside. Staff will be checked daily for COVID-19 symptoms by the supervising director or nurse. Staff who display COVID-19 symptoms will immediately be isolated on camp and offered testing. Staff who test positive for COVID-19 will be quarantined for 14 days and sent home as soon as possible to recover.

Notification: If campers and/or staff test positive or display symptoms of the COVID-19 virus, the Montezuma Health Department will be notified within 24 hours. San Juan Bible Camp will cooperate with the Montezuma Health Department to determine actions needed in the case of positive symptoms or positive cases of the COVID-19 virus.

Chapel: Chapel will be held under a tent with open sides for fresh air. Each cabin cohort will be assigned a table that is socially distanced for seating during chapel.

Dining: The chapel tent will be used for the dining room as well. Each cabin cohort will be assigned the same table for dining. The table will be disinfected before and after every meal on a daily basis. Campers will be required to wash their hands before each meal. A cabin will go through the food line socially distanced and sit at their assigned table. Drinks will be served from a designated table. Meal service will be cafeteria style for each camper to choose what they want and handed their plate at the end of the food service line.

Activities: The program assistant will stay socially distanced to instruct and supervise unless a camper's safety is in jeopardy. If the program assistant cannot be socially distanced due to the activity, they will be required to wear a mask. Activity equipment will be disinfected between groups on a daily basis. Activities will be altered so that campers can maintain a 6 foot distance from other campers who are not in their cabin cohort.

## Cleaning

### Weekly Cleaning

All facilities are thoroughly cleaned each week with a disinfectant cleaner, wiped down and allowed to dry.

### Daily Cleaning

All facilities are cleaned on a daily basis Monday through Friday with a disinfectant cleaner, wiped down and allowed to dry.

The cabins are cleaned each day. Common surfaces will be disinfected each day.

The bathhouses will be thoroughly cleaned 2 times per day, disinfected 4 times per day and in between each cabin group.

The lodge bathrooms will be thoroughly cleaned 2 times per day and disinfected 4 times per day.

The lodge dining room and tent dining will be thoroughly cleaned 3 times per day.

The lodge kitchen will be thoroughly cleaned after each meal.

Training: Staff will be trained in cleaning standards at the beginning of the camp season

**Parents/Guardians:** Parents/Guardians assume the risk for themselves or anyone in their family group on San Juan Bible Camp property of contracting the COVID-19 virus. Parents/Guardians agree not to hold San Juan Bible Camp negligent if anyone in their family group contracts the COVID-19 virus. Parents/Guardians agree to cover the costs for any medical treatment of themselves or their children in the event they contract the COVID-19 virus. Parents/Guardians realize that San Juan Bible Camp is doing everything it can to keep campers, staff and guests on property safe from the COVID-19 virus. Parents/Guardians acknowledge that virus contraction is extremely difficult to pinpoint but San Juan Bible Camp is doing everything it can to keep campers safe from the virus or any harm.

It is required by the State of Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment for parents/guardians to give permission for campers to be tested for COVID-19 while at camp. It is not, however, required for campers to be tested at camp, even in the event that a camper has symptoms. As always, every effort will be taken to contact the parent or emergency contact in the event that a camper experiences symptoms of COVID-19 virus, any other illness or injury.
